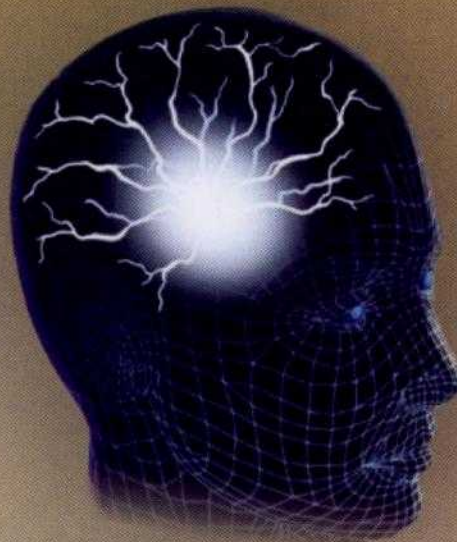

INTRODUCTION

The importance of Intellectual Property Rights for International Trade and Commerce has been recognized the world over. Many international agreements to regulate grant and exploitation of Intellectual Property Rights have been signed between countries of the world either bilaterally or in the form of multilateral agreements. The establishment of WTO and signing of TRIPS agreement, to which India is a signatory, has sharply focused the role of Intellectual Property in International Trade.

The continuing evolution of Intellectual Property Law presents a complex issue for many with interest in Patents, Designs, Trade Marks, Geographical Indications and Copyrights. As such there is a need for improvement and dissemination of the knowledge base. In order to assist the global community in understanding the issues surrounding Intellectual Property, National Institute for Intellectual Property Management has been developed to facilitate creation, use and exploitation of Intellectual Property and working of the Intellectual Property System.

INTRODUCTION TO INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

Intellectual Property means the property represented by the product emanating from creativity of the human mind, human intellect and creative ideas. It can be an invention, original design, visual symbol, origin of particular product, artistic creation etc. In earlier times, only physical or tangible assets like movable and immovable properties fetched the maximum value and the owner had an exclusive right over it. With the passage of time, new ideas cropped in, new concepts and means for the progress of mankind were thought of and new inventions came to the forefront, which brought about industrial, economical and cultural development in the society.

VARIOUS INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

Patent is an exclusive right granted by the Government to the applicant for his disclosed invention of product or process which should be new, non-obvious, useful and patentable as per the patentability criteria laid down in the Patent Law. Patent offers technical solution to a technical problem.

Designs protect any shape, configuration, pattern, color and lines, creations of the appearance of industrial products.

Trade Mark is a visual symbol in the form of word, name, logo, label etc, as applied to vendable article, with a view to indicate origin of manufacture or service or vendor in that respect and enable customers to distinguish the product of one manufacturer from the goods of the other.

Geographical Indication (G.I.) identifies agricultural, natural or manufactured goods, originating from a definite territory. GI is an indication or appellation of the origin of a particular product.

Copyright is protection that covers published and unpublished literary, scientific and artistic work. Copyright relates to the exclusive right to do or authorize to do certain acts in relation to original literary, dramatic or musical work, artistic creations (paintings, photographs, work of architecture) cinematographic films, sound recording, software programme etc.

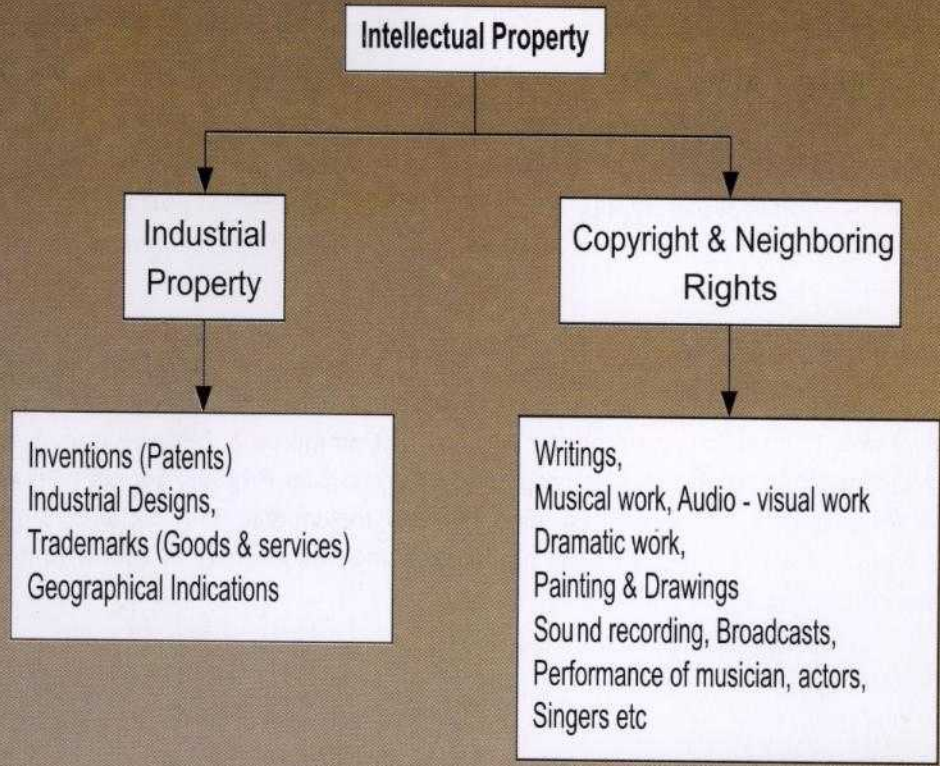
National Institute for Intellectual Property Management organizes diversified training programs to meet the various and ever changing needs for training.
